Child Protection Officer Seminar

Adrian Lole, Lifesaving Development Manager of Lifesavers UK, will update members on the current Lifesavers-RLSS Child Protection policy and how it applies to lifesaving and lifeguard training.

If you train lifeguards who are under 18 years of age, you will be required to attend this seminar. In addition, all sites where lifeguard training takes

place, must implement a Child Protection policy if trainees under the age of 18 years will be undertaking training or assessment.

Trainers who wish to organise classes for lifesaving awards such as the new Bronze Medallion, are also expected to attend.

Lifesaving and Life Support Update

Are your lifesaving and life support skills up to date ? With the requirements for all trainers to hold a resuscitation certificate, this hands-on seminar will update trainers on the latest techniques.

The course will also present a summary of the findings of the European Resuscitation Council conference in Budapest, and show the way that resuscitation may be
